Osborn Seeks Continuation of Override

This November, community members within the Osborn School District boundaries will be asked to vote on the Osborn School District Maintenance & Operations Override. This is a continuation override of the current 15% override approved by voters in 2018. Being a continuation override, this means there are NO NEW TAXES if passed. The override will continue to support art, music, PE, library, gifted programming, full day kindergarten, class size reductions, professional learning, English learner supports, and technology staffing. Did You Know? Osborn 1:1 Initiative Moves to the Home

The effect of our community supported Bond and Override elections have had tremendous impact in classrooms—and now in Osborn student homes. Osborn is a 1:1 district, meaning every student has an allocated laptop in school. iSchool students have devices at homes connecting them to their classrooms. With the federal Emergency Connectivity Fund grant, we are about to start this fall sending laptops home for some grade level starting at the middle school to continue learning at homes and get the laptops back at the end of the school year to be used for next school year. Osborn's Technology Director **Jamal Dana** devised a 5-year Technology Plan, once the community demonstrated the commitment to keeping Osborn schools on the cutting edge of technology. Using Bond/Override money, Osborn schools are able to implement our 5-year technology plan to keep our Curriculum up to date, able to roll out devices to students and teachers, and to keep our infrastructure up-to-date.
