Osborn Begins Teacher Residency Program





Eight new teacher candidates have begun their year-long residency in Osborn classrooms as part of the newly established

Arizona Teacher Residency Program (AZTR). In partnership with Northern Arizona University, the Arizona K12 Center, and with significant funding through the Arizona Department of Education, this program embeds the teacher candidates in our district

classrooms, working in close partnership with highly effective teachers in the district. The teacher candidates and supervising teachers are supported by district Teacher Residency Program Coordinator Kelly Kesterson-Walker, who has been instrumental as a Master Teacher at Encanto School for the past 11 years. The pictures below show what this support model looks like in real time. Teacher candidate Kylie Dunn, in just her second week on the job delivers a lesson to her 3rd grade class. Her supervising teacher Maria Garcia at times is there to whisper coach her through some aspects of the lesson, or supports students in their learning. Kelly was present in the room to talk with Maria about the objectives of the lesson and how



she has supported her in preparation. Kelly is ready at the lesson's conclusion with a note of encouragement and reflection. With this level of support, our teacher candidates will have 10 **DRTHERN** months of guidance, modeling, preparation, and focus on craftsmanship. Building the next **ARIZONA** generation of teachers in Osborn and Arizona is serious work. This level of teacher preparation values and elevates the teaching preparation!

concepts, and knife skills. We cannot wait to taste the new, fresh, clean label recipes coming our way this year. Healthy, nutritious, delicious!








Keeping Our Community Informed about COVID


As we return to school with COVID still in our midst for a 3rd year, check back to our website and social media outlets, listen to robocalls, and read emails and notices sent home you may receive about health concerns or changing community data. With mandates around precautions lifted, it is important that you use the information we will continue to share with

you to make the best decisions for you, your children, and your family about how to stay safe.

CDC Recommendations as of August 11, 2022

- End 6-foot social distancing requirement
- Contact tracing should be limited to hospitals and highrisk group-living situations
- De-emphasizing need for regular testing to screen for COVID-19
- No quarantine necessary if exposed but not infected
- Keeps the same
- Test if you have symptoms
- Isolate for 5 days after testing positive and mask for 10
- o Recommend wearing masks indoors if in area of High spread/infectio
